

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## PREFACE

Last time Somalia came to the attention of the Turkish public was with the service of the Turkish brigade under the United Nations (UN) Peacekeeping Force in 1992. The Turkish soldiers served in Mogadishu for two years and left the country in 1995 after the US-led international force and then the UN Peacekeeping Force failed to maintain security in Somalia. There was a long period of disengagement until the naval task force was sent to the region in 2009, within the framework of the UN Security Council resolution, against the piracy threatening international trade, in the Gulf of Aden.

The efforts to ensure stability in Somalia and the establishment of transitional governments in the 2000s brought about the initiatives of Somalia to establish its international relations again. In this period, with its economic development and its increasing presence in the international arena, Turkey became one of the major countries that the Somali Transitional Government of Somalia has established relations with. Turkey hosted UN-led Istanbul Conference on Somalia in 2010. Turkey and Somalia reached bilateral agreements at the margins of Istanbul Conference. These were pioneering indicators of Turkey-Somali relations.

In 2011, Turkey's humanitarian intervention operations, to lessen the effect of the humanitarian crisis that hit Somalia hard, had a dramatic impact on the development of Turkey-Somalia relationship. Recep Tayyip Erdogan's visit, then the Prime Minister of Turkey, to Somali Capital Mogadishu with a large delegation, has transformed the relations from limited fields such as security operations and political engagements under the umbrella of multilateral institutions to intertwined multifaceted and multilayered relations.

Africa Foundation organized an academic symposium on 19-20 August 2021 in Ankara to discuss about ten years of Turkey-Somalia relations (between 2011-2021) and its impact on both Somali and Turkish people. The experts reflected on how this decade of engagement affected different sectors as well as societal, political, and economic relations of two countries. As a result, 20 papers were presented in 6 sessions under different topics such as political relations, security, economy, development, health, social relations, and culture in the symposium. This book in your hand covers most of the papers presented in this symposium.

The first part of the book, titled "History, Politics, Security and Peacebuilding" has 6 articles. The authors of the chapters in the section discuss the historical perspective and multilayered dimension of Turkey-Somali relations, the rebuilding the security sector which is critical component of reconstructing state and order, the relationship between Somalia and the perception of Turkey in Somaliland, the role of Turkish and Somali non-governmental organizations in peacebuilding and the perspectives of the Somali women in Turkey's peacebuilding activities.

There are 5 articles in the second chapter, under the title of "Economy and Development". Issues are discussed in this chapter are emerging trends in the trade relations between Turkey and Somalia, the role of growing Somali business diaspora in Turkey on trade relations, the role of Turkey in reviving Somalia's health system, academic profile, training experiences and career pathways of graduates of Somalia Mogadishu Recep Tayyip Erdoğan Vocational School and the impact of human capital development programs in Somalia. Chapter three presents four articles under the title of "Society and Culture." Cultural diplomacy and diaspora mobility: narratives and reflections from the Somali diaspora in Istanbul on Turkey-Somalia relations, Somali diaspora-Turkish relationships: changing Somali diaspora perspectives on Turkey, understanding the rising popularity of Turkish drama among the Somali youth and learning Turkish language: perceptions of the Somali students are the articles presented in this chapter.

The contributors of this edited volume assess the growing relationship of Turkey and Somalia in diverse sectors and fields with articles based on qualitative and quantitative research. Economy, security, history, society, health, education, culture, social networks and many other topics are covered in this book. I would like to thank our scholars for their devoted and qualified research.
